



RESIDENTIAL IRRIGATION SURVEY

The average single family home uses about 70% to 80% of their monthly water use on outside irrigation during the summer months. In an effort to assist residents in reducing outdoor water consumption within the Carson River Watershed, the Carson Water Subconservancy District in conjunction with the Gardnerville Ranchos General Improvement District is offering a residential irrigation survey. Research has shown that most homeowners want guidance and benefit from education on proper water conservation techniques, but do not have the resources readily available. CWSD in conjunction with your water utility is pleased to offer this residential irrigation survey at no cost.

The Residential Irrigation Survey will be performed by a representative of the CWSD and will include the following;

1. A packet of information on water conservation tips, including water restrictions or recommendations provided by us from your water utility.
2. Checking water meter for any possible water leaks.
3. Checking irrigation clocks for proper settings, i.e., days and times.
4. Observing each station in use to detect over watering, improper sprinkler heads, rotors and drip lines.
5. Check for broken or misaligned sprinklers.
6. Advise customers on most efficient times for outdoor irrigation with regard to weather and or environmental conditions.
7. Customers will receive a user friendly site inspection sheet with our recommendations.

This program is designed to help reduce residential outdoor water consumption, especially during peak demand times. The effective use of our limited water resources is vital to maintaining our thriving communities and healthy watershed.
